Bowlers urged to back new campaign

Bowls England is urging all clubs to back a new campaign to secure the sport's future.

Local authority funding cuts and pressure from developers are just two of the issues threatening many bowling facilities.

Bowls England has teamed up with the Sport and Recreation Alliance to help clubs raise the profile of the sport of bowls among MPs - and therefore to increase the chance of future Government decisions favouring clubs at a local level.

Tony Allcock MBE, Bowls England Chief Executive, said: "Local authorities are making significant cutbacks across their services to meet the Government's

deficit reduction plan, and feedback from clubs over the winter has shown that bowls is not, and will not, be immune. This could have a significant impact on our sport for generations to come if we do not take some positive action. We cannot reverse some of the decisions that have already been taken, but we can provide clubs with the best possible chance of staying open by raising the profile of the sport with their local MP."

Bowls has already made the national news this year when John Woodcock MP introduced a Bill in Parliament in response to green closures in his own constituency of Barrow-in-Furness. The Bill seeks to give greater planning protection to greens from landowners seeking to build on them and could be used for all greens across the country. He also tabled an Early Day Motion (a petition) which has been signed by MPs from across the political spectrum.

Tony Allcock added: "This action generated lots of support in Westminster and many news stories across the country. We now need to build on this momentum and support the Bill when it gets a second reading in Parliament."

All clubs have been asked to write to their local MP, asking them to support the Early Day Motion.

New laws for 2011 season

Following adoption at the World Bowls meeting held last October, all players are reminded that the Laws of the Sport of Bowls Crystal Mark Second Edition are now in use in England.

The two main changes affecting general play are:

- 1. The winner of the previous end will deliver the jack and the first bowl on the next end, with the exception of an extra end when there will be a coin toss with the winner having the choice.
- 2. The Skip will be responsible for keeping the scorecard in all forms of the game pairs, triples and fours.

Tony Allcock MBE, Bowls England Chief Executive, said: "Bowls England had proposed that the law on 'giving the jack away' be changed in response to calls from many clubs and individual bowlers during the consultation process and is therefore delighted that this has now been approved and is now implemented."

Sport England Small Grants Scheme amended

Sport England has made the following announcement with regard to its Small Grants Programme:

"A decision was made at the beginning of the Small Grants programme to support bowls clubs to purchase essential ground maintenance equipment if a financial and operational need could be justified. Our policy has always stated that we 'do not fund the maintenance or replacement of existing equipment' and due to the popularity of the Small Grants programme and the competition for funding it is highly unlikely that we will fund projects of this nature in the future. This means that an application for any equipment that is like for like replacement is outside of policy because it is simply meeting an existing running cost and will not be able to deliver any additional output for the investment. *Examples of projects we won't fund include a mower/roller to replace an* old one where no additional sporting delivery will take place. Examples of projects that we may fund include a new mower/roller to cope with additional use, for example, on a new green or a club that has not previously owned equipment (mower, roller, irrigation system etc), or equipment has previously been hired."

World Bowls Review Sub-Committee

John Bell, Men's Senior Team Manager and Performance Director at the 2010 Commonwealth Games, is Bowls England's representative on the World Bowls Review Sub-Committee.

The formation of the Review Sub-Committee follows agreement by World Bowls Council Members in October last year that the time had come for World Bowls to look at its structure and organisation.

The Committee will also identify the responsibilities and obligations of Member National Authorities, including Bowls England, compared to World Bowls.

John Bell had been nominated for the post by the Board of Bowls England.

World Bowls has announced that the other members of the Committee are:

Louise Martin CBE, Secretary of the Commonwealth Games Federation and Chair of Sportscotland, has agreed to serve as an 'independent' on the new Committee.

World Bowls President, John McArdle, will chair the Committee and World Bowls Chief Executive Gary Smith will serve as secretary to the Committee.

The Committee has been asked to provide a final report to the Board of World Bowls by December 2011.

Bowls England statement on CRB Checks

Bowls England wishes to inform members that following the Government's announcement of the scaling back of the Vetting & Barring Scheme, it is continuing to look at the detail in conjunction with TMG, which administers Criminal Records Bureau (CRB) applications for the sport of bowls.

At this stage, there is a requirement that Members continue with CRB applications where there is 'eligibility', which means that applications will only be processed from Members who meet one of the following criteria:

- 1. Regularly teaching, training, instructing or in sole charge of children under the age of 18. This must take place on a regular basis and is not just for 'one off' events such as open days that may be attended by children under the age of 18
- 2. Frequently (once a week or more) caring for, teaching, training, instructing or advising children under the age of 18
- 3. Frequently (once a week or more) caring for, training, instructing or advising vulnerable adults

Club Welfare Officers/Child Protection Officers may also apply for a CRB check should they feel that it is relevant to their role within their club or county.

Bowls England understands the Government and the CRB have indicated that they are determined to clamp down on ineligible checks, and TMG has further advised that it will refuse to process ineligible checks. Therefore Bowls England will not process CRB applications from Members unless they meet one of the above criteria.
